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Tawheed, Also spelled Tauheed or Tawhid, is the Islamic concept of the oneness of God. It is the fundamental belief in Islam that God is one and unique, without any partners or equals. Tauheed is central to Islamic theology and is considered the foundation of the Islamic faith. It encompasses the belief in the oneness of God's essence, attributes, and actions. The concept of tauheed is expressed in the Islamic declaration of faith, known as the Shahada, which states, "There is no god but Allah, and Muhammad is the messenger of Allah."



Definition of Tawheed, Tawheed is the belief in the oneness of Allah in His lordship, worship, and names and attributes. It emphasizes that Allah is the sole creator, sustainer, and ruler of the universe.



Categories of Tawheed, "Tawheed" categories Tauheed into three main categories:

Tauheed ar-Rububiyyah (Oneness of Lordship)
The belief that Allah is the only creator, sustainer, and controller of the universe.



Prohibition of Shirk, The prohibition of Shirk (associating partners with Allah) in any form, whether it be in worship, beliefs, or actions. It warns against practices that may lead to Shirk, such as seeking intercession from beings other than Allah.



Importance of Tawheed in Worship,

The importance of sincerity in worship, highlighting that all acts of worship must be done solely for the sake of Allah, without any desire for worldly gain or recognition.



Repentance and Forgiveness,

The importance of repentance for sins and highlights Allah's mercy and forgiveness for those who sincerely repent and return to Him.



Rejecting Superstitions and Innovations,

"Tawheed" warns against superstitions and innovations in religion, emphasizing the importance of following the Quran and Sunnah in all matters of faith and practice.
